#### Syllabus for Ph.D. Course-work in Assamese

The PhD Course work is of a duration of six months.

The syllabus prescribes six courses, viz., MPCASM 1016, MPCASM 1026, MPCASM 1032, MPCASM 1046, MPCASM 1056 and MPCASM 1066. The first three (MPCASM 1016, MPCASM 1026, MPCASM 1032) of these courses are core (compulsory), and the rest are optional. Research scholars will have to choose any two out of the three optional courses. Thus, a research scholar will have to study five of these six courses.

The MPCASM 1032 course is of 2 credits. The other five courses are of 6 credits.

Total marks for the courses MPCASM 1016, MPCASM 1026, MPCASM 1046, MPCASM 1056 and MPCASM 1066 shall be 100, out of which 20 will be internal and 80 will be external (which means that the question papers of these courses in the end-semester examination will be of 80 marks).

The internal examination marks for MPCASM 1016, MPCASM 1046, MPCASM 1056 and MPCASM 1066 will be based on all the four units, while that for MPCASM 1026 will be based on Unit IV only.

The MPCASM 1032 course has not been detailed in the syllabus. It will be a MOOC course on research and publication ethics, available on the SWAYAM platform. Research scholars will have to do this course when asked by the Department. The pass certificate issued by the SWAYAM platform will be taken into account. If a suitable course on research and publication ethics is not available on the platform for long, the Department will opt for the "Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)" course as prescribed by the UGC in December 2019.

The courses detailed in the present syllabus indicate only the external marks.
