The annual research journal of the department of philosophy, *Gauhati University Journal of Philosophy, (GUJP)*, ISSN 2456-3285, is to publish its second volume (2017) in print form in a short while.

Original articles on any branch of philosophy, review of published philosophy books, and comments and discussions on articles published in earlier issues of GUJP may be submitted for publication by authors of all categories – teachers, researchers, students and professionals belonging to any discipline.

Guidelines for submission of articles and other write-ups:

1. Articles written in English language (in two copies, one in MS Word and one in PDF) using a distinct font are to be emailed to editorgujp@gmail.com
2. An Abstract of not more than two hundred words should be submitted along with the paper. It also should include a few key words related to the paper.
3. The author shall take sufficient care to avoid spelling and grammatical mistakes.
4. The author has to attach a self-certification to the effect that the write-up has not been published /not sent for publication anywhere else.
5. Name, address, designation, institutional affiliation, phone no. and email id of the author must be provided.
6. Non-English terms are to be written using diacritical marks wherever applicable. The same are to be italicized.
7. Italics, not bold types, should be used to show emphasis.
8. Citations/references are to be given using MLA style (please see the style sheet)
9. Notes, if any, are to be given at the end of the paper using serial numbers (1,2,3...) for which there should be corresponding super-scripted numbers in the appropriate place in the body of the text.
10. The articles will go through a double peer-review and a plagiarism test for selection.
11. The author would be informed about acceptance or otherwise of their paper in due course of time.
12. The editorial board reserves the right to reject any paper on reasons considered appropriate.
13. **Deadline for receiving write-ups for this volume is 31 August, 2017.**

Style Sheet

In-Text Citations

References in the text must be cited by author and page number in parentheses. Examples:

- a. In case of a single author: (Hatfield 48–52)
- b. Two or more authors with the same surname cited: (S. Smith48), (N. Smith35). If the initials are also same, then the full names should be written.
- c. For two authors: (Caro and Macarthur 14). For three or more than three authors the last name of the first author followed by *et al.* (Booth et al. 35)
- d. More than one work of the same author: (Frye, *Anatomy* 55), (Frey, *Double Vision* 156)
- e. Quoting/paraphrasing from another author's quotation: (qtd. in Gottlieb 289) [cite Gottlieb's work in the list of works cited]
- f. To include two or more works in a single parenthetical reference: (Clark 12; Hatfield 124)
- g. To cite common literatures, like Scriptures, use either the title of the particular work together with its chapter and verse numbers or the editor's or translator's name [whichever way one prefers, the same must also be used to begin the entry in the works-cited list].

List of Works Cited

Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a works-cited list. Alphabetical order of the surname of authors is to be followed. In case of two or more authors with the same surname alphabetize by their first names; and in case of two or more works by the same author alphabetize by titles of the works. Style:

Single or two authors:

Three or more co-authors:

Booth, Wayne C., et al. *The Craft of Research*. 2nd ed., U of Chicago P, 2003.

Book chapter:

Clark, Kelly James. "Naturalism and its Discontent." *The Blackwell Companion to Naturalism*, edited by Clark, Wiley Blackwell, 2016, pp.1-15.

Two or more works by the same author:

Frye, Northrop. *Anatomy of Criticism: Four Essays*. Princeton UP, 1957.

---. *The Double Vision: Language and Meaning in Religion*. U of Toronto P, 1991.

A translation:

A multivolume work:

An Introduction, a preface or a forword:

A journal article (print & web):
